

FROM YOUR MINISTER

Grace and Peace to all of you

A year ago, I sat in my office pining over what December might look like—we were still in the grips of COVID—we were still riding the waves of *what if*.

And here we are, \a year later, still trying crawl out of a surreal almost three years. We are not the same as we were three years ago. But, that is what exile does to you. It changes you. It lasts longer than you could have ever imagined. And, it also comes with a very bumpy ending, with a child-like chorus that repeats, "Are we there yet?"

It was this imagery of exile and return that hit Caryn Boegel and me as we sat in my office looking over stewardship resources. And, one set of resources hit us both hard; it used the familiar passage from Jeremiah and the theme, **A Future with Hope**.



I WILL FULFILL TO YOU MY PROMISE AND BRING YOU BACK TO THIS PLACE, FOR SURELY I KNOW THE PLANS I HAVE FOR YOU, SAYS GOD, PLANS FOR YOUR WELFARE AND NOT FOR HARM, TO GIVE YOU A FUTURE WITH HOPE.
+ JEREMIAH 29:10-II

November is Stewardship month. We are going to be diving into this theme head first. Letters will be mailed with pledge cards, giving charts, and words on generosity. We start a sermon series the last Sunday of October, focused around the idea of separation and exile, a community of return, and being sent out to change the world. This will culminate on Stewardship/Gratitude Sunday, where we will set with the Jeremiah text and dream. We will have videos from congregation members. There will be pictures that give life to the difference your gifts and offerings make. We will be offering prompts during the week that with invite you to consider all the blessings that you have here at Pilgrim and in your daily living. It will be steeped in reflection, *because we cannot know where we are going without remembering where we have been*.

Pilgrim's future is exciting. We are talking, thinking, praying, and doing things I would have never imagined. But that's what a season of exile does—it changes you. It reorients you. I used to be aghast at online worship. It terrified me. It did not make sense to me. I struggled with the idea of doing communion over a screen. It felt so wrong and foreign to me. But on the other side of exile, I can see that it is one of the ways that we remain an inclusive congregation. It challenged me to consider: if I use the words *open table*, surely that reaches to the people who worship in their homes with graham crackers and tea. I have been changed and so has Pilgrim. So, this stewardship season, we are invited to honor the changes, wrestle with the challenges, and continue to look forward to our future.

You are part of that future. And so I am. WE ARE THAT FUTURE. I have always believed everything we need is here. Exile has not changed that. Everything we need is here. And this stewardship season, we are invited to give pause, name our gratitude, and recognize we have been and will continue to be stronger together.

We are still the light on the hill, friends.

And by the grace of God and our work together,
we will be for generations to come.

Welcome to stewardship season.




WOMEN'S JOURNEY will meet in Kalweit Hall at 12:30 pm on Tuesday, November 15.

PBS Video – *African Americans (Many Rivers to Cross)* November 19, 7:30 am


