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#### FROM YOUR MINISTER

Grace and Peace to you,

After church this past Sunday (February 25), I looked at John Reiter and Sue Willman as we were leaving the sanctuary and I said, "Lent is long." John looked surprised and said, "but it is only the second Sunday of Lent." To which I responded, "Exactly."

I would like to mention that it was on this Sunday that sunshine poured into the sanctuary. The trees swayed outside, and I thought I saw a few birds bounce quickly between the window frames. I opened the carport door and the air felt and smelled like spring. I got home and looked at my daffodils peeking up through the ground. I sighed, "It is only the second Sunday of Lent." Even though I hoped somewhere inside my soul that I was wrong. That it was actually the fifth Sunday of Lent (Palm Sunday) and we would get to celebrate Easter and new life in the next few days. And then, as I laid my work bag down on our kitchen counter, I saw the Amazon package containing a new computer mouse that I ordered this past week. I ordered it on Wednesday. It arrived on Thursday. Again, I sighed, "It is only the second Sunday of Lent." I wished in that moment that Easter would arrive as fast as my Amazon package. I wished this morning that Lent would move along posthaste.

And I grumbled to myself. Lent is not like Amazon deliveries. Lent is a process. Lent is a journey. Lent is long. And sometimes Lent feels long.

It is one of those seasons that is long on purpose. It is the longest intentional season within the church liturgical year. In the northern hemisphere, it also comes during one of the most difficult seasons of the year—late winter and early spring—when it can be uncomfortably difficult to wait, especially when the world taunts us with daffodils and early arriving robins.

Lent will be over—soon, actually. In a few weeks, we will gather on Palm Sunday, and the Adult Choir will offer the Easter Cantata. And then, the week after, we will celebrate Easter. And the daffodils will be in bloom. And the birds will dance. And the buds will appear on the trees. *And Lent will be over right on time*.

It would be lovely if we could control the movement of the seasons, lingering in the ones we like and moving past the ones we don't. But it doesn't work that way. We must live and move through the process of these seasons.

It is March. I hope that all each of us can catch a glimpse of the beauty that lives in this month and this season. Whether it a moment of sunshine that bends through the window, or the birds that dance on top of fresh, spring snow, or the daffodils that stand tall and bright against the morning frost, or the cold wind of a late winter snow shower, there is beauty in this season of waiting.

Lent is exactly as long as it needs to be. And Easter arrives, right on time.






During the month of March, we will be exploring the stories Palm Sunday, Jesus washing his disciples' feet, Jesus praying in the garden, and more!



## Platform Lift (Elevator) Replacement Funding Project

Announcing a Capital Fund Drive to fund the replacement of the platform lift (Elevator), including the entrance/exit doors, with openers on the Basement Level and Carport Level, along with the control gate on the Upper Level. After spending multiple years trying to maintain the lift at an operational and reliable level, the uptime is not acceptable. In late December 2022, the platform lift experienced a mechanical failure of the support bearing for the lift screw drive. The manufacturer of the lift has been out of business for over 20 years and repair parts are difficult to find and extremely costly. The Building & Asset Committee recommended to Church Council to replace the platform lift with a new hydraulic lift. Church Council subsequentially approved the replacement project and at the annual Congregational meeting the congregation approved the replace of the platform lift and entry access points. The project cost is: \$43,671 for the indoor vertical platform lift, \$1,820 for electrical rework and state code upgrades, \$599 for adding an additional Rath ADA Phone and 24-hour connection for emergency calls, \$2,081 for rework of the landing openings to accommodate the new doorframes including Village of Grafton permit fees and \$2329 in a contingency fund for unplanned/unexpected costs. The expected project cost estimate is \$50,500. The goal is to raise the funds to cover the cost of this project by the end of June 2024.

# COUNCIL / OFFICE HOURS

#### **APPROVED COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS—January 16, 2024**

#### Treasurer's Report

Regular giving for December \$32,000. Overall general giving exceeded the 2023 budget by \$17,700.

Endowment increased \$13,000 in December. Year to date the endowments are up \$40,000

Operating expenses were \$32,000 in December.

Total operating expenses for the year 2023 were 295,000. Expenses in 2023 were \$10,000 under the approved budget.

YTD electric and gas are up \$2,000.

Building and maintenance expenses in December included R9,000-5,000 for HVAC and R4,000 for the lift.

Question about what was underspent in 2023. It was indicated that there was a \$19,000 variance in program staff compensation.

#### Pastor's Report:

Discussion of sabbatical interim.

Emma moves to affirm the action of recommending and supporting SBB for the position of Interim Sabbatical Pastor beginning on May 20, 2024, through August 26, 2024, for the duration of Rev. Ashley Nolte's sabbatical.

Jill and Ashley will follow up with the candidate and discuss the process and the candidate's intent, which includes the creation of a contract and job description with the staff relations team.

#### Committee Liaison Updates:

Not for Profit Security Grant team meets on January 18, 2024. Bill Maca gave an update and summary of the work of the NPSG Grant team. Building and Assets (Dave Nestler):

-Copula: JOS Schmidt - quote to repair copula is approximately \$65,000. We are waiting for insurance to respond with the exact amount covered by insurance. Included in the request is the potential to re-roof the copula because the necessary equipment (Lift) will be already on hand (The \$13,000 is not included in the original estimate from the JOS Schmidt). Waiting on the exact numbers from the insurance company. Right now, we know no exact numbers. Just estimates right now.

- Burner for the furnace was repaired.
- Getting quotes to replace all three air conditioning units.
- shed project is now complete: storage and lighting
- Lift: currently the lift is not working due to a failure in one of the bearings (estimate: \$7,100), BA has gotten three estimates to replace the whole unit. The estimates are as follows:
  - \*1. All Access Elevator: Full replacements including doors and gate: approximately 43,600 (This does not include other necessary parts and components: phone, battery backup, and a lock switch for safety reasons- all in ~55,000)
  - \*2. Ascend Elevator: approximately \$52,000 all in
  - \*3. All About Access Elevator: \$38,000 all in (keeping existing doors on carport and lower level)

Required to complete project: 1. a permit (\$2,500 state permit), 2. 50% down payment in order to manufacture the unit.

- Dustin Beck moves that Council approve the estimate provided by All About Access- with the recommendation that full replacement of the lift and doors be a priority. This motion grants permission to Building and Assets to move forward with obtaining the necessary permit and down payments. Further conversation with the building and assets will occur to finalize specific recommendations for the replacement of doors or utilization of current doors. The council approves the expense of the down payment required to start the project and obtain permits.

#### Old Business:

Talked through the annual meeting process

Solidified annual meeting agenda and defined council roles

#### **New Business:**

The Council will host the Lent meal with the Inclusion Team on March 20.

Refined the budget presented at the annual meeting.

#### Action steps:

Jill and Ashley will talk to the intern candidate to secure interest.

Notify Building and Assets with the recommendation for the replacement of the lift.

Invisible Disabilities

It may be clear that a person using a wheelchair or a white cane has a disability. However, it is estimated that about 80% of disabilities are not immediately apparent to others. These invisible (or hidden) disabilities include conditions like chronic pain or fatigue, learning differences, chronic diseases, mental illness, brain injuries, vertigo, or many other conditions. An estimated 30 million Americans live with a hidden disability.

People with invisible disabilities live with the challenge of their disability but also can face misunderstanding or hostility from people who do not believe that they have a disability. Regardless of whether people disclose they have a disability or not, it is important for all of us to acknowledge that appearances don't tell the whole story about a person's lived experience.

True compassion in ministry and relationships is based on equality.

In any given year, one in four people is dealing with a mental illness, also known as a brain disorder. They are your brother, sister, the man across the street, the person next to you in the pew.

Gather data on effective marketing practices within the area and utilize them to develop marketing strategies.

Plan targeted events to engage the wider community.

Facilitate and organize Pilgrim's participation in wider community events which include but are not limited to: area parades, festivals, local school district communication, volunteer fairs, etc.

Prepare, organize, and plan targeted social media posts and events.

In partnership with the Office Manager, communicate with the Grafton Chamber of Commerce, local papers, and community organizations on events hosted at Pilgrim Church.

Stay connected with local school boards, police departments, fire departments, and the Ozaukee Not for Profit Center.

In partnership with the Office Manager, manage the church's webpage and provide oversight of social media platforms.


