FROM YOUR MINISTER

Grace and peace to you,

We have somehow already reached the final month of this sabbatical interim time.

From my perspective, time has been passing incredibly fast. I'm so grateful for the opportunities to get to know so many of you in the last two months, and I am excited for all the ways we will continue to get to know each other in the next few weeks. As a seminary student still early in the process of discerning where a life in ministry will take me, this summer has been an incredible opportunity. I've been so grateful for the trust and support of the council, staff, and entire congregation as you have allowed me to walk with you on various journeys this summer.

When Jesus sent the disciples out in pairs to teach and heal people in all sorts of places, he told them to take no extra clothes or money, but to rely completely on the hospitality of those they are ministering to (Mk 6:7-10). I didn't quite follow these instructions this summer—I brought a full car of stuff with me from St. Louis. But I still have been reliant on your welcome, on you letting me into your lives in a way that requires vulnerability and courage. And in a time where it feels like everyone is so busy and society is completely divided, these practices of courageous welcome are incredibly important. Simple ways of getting to know each other—of listening with kindness and of assuming good intentions of those we meet can feel countercultural in comparison to the fighting we too often see on the news and social media. I hope the kind of welcome you've extended to me is the kind of welcome you will continue to extend to all those you meet, no matter who they are or where they are on life's journey.

And as this time where I have been the new person welcomed comes to a close, some members have been wondering how we might stay in touch. The UCC recommends that authorized guidelines follow a best practice of either initially unfriending or moving all congregants to a restricted list upon leaving a church, and so I have refrained from making social media connections with you while I am here knowing how short this time is. However, in the new year, when a significant amount of time has allowed us to fully move on from my time as your pastor, I will accept requests if you wish to connect personally at that time.

In the meantime, we will continue to do the work of the church together: to extend Christ's welcome both on Sunday mornings and in all places we go throughout the week—work you will continue with Pastor Ashley as she returns at end of the month following this essential time of rest.



Platform Lift (Elevator) Replacement Funding Project

<u>Completion Update:</u> The Lift frame and doors have been installed. We are currently waiting on one call box that is on backorder. All final trim work will take place over the next couple of weeks. When the project is completed, the final step will be the State Inspection. The Property & Grounds Team are hopeful the lift will be ready by mid-August. Thank you again so much for your patience and monetary gifts, and thank you to Neal Hobbs, John Carli, and those team members who have been working steadily on the lift prep work.

Pilgrim UCC Council Meeting May 16, 2024 6:30pm

Treasurer's Report

Regular giving for April was \$22k, \$8k below April last year. Regular giving is \$10k YTD ahead of last year and \$14k ahead of our 2024 budget. There was another \$9.5K gifted towards the lift project (total of \$41k has been received through the end of April). Endowment fund values in April declined \$14k but are still up \$10k YTD. Operating Expenses totaled \$27k for the month (\$1.6k below budget). April spending includes a catch-up bill from our snow plowing contractor and charges from Sage for annual software renewal. In summary, April shows a \$4k operating loss before depreciation but a \$15k gain YTD.

Pastor's Report – Ashley had sent prior to the meeting and there were no questions regarding her written report. Additional items discussed:

Process of discernment with Paul Zachow continues.

There may be a wedding at Pilgrim this summer. Sylvie will officiate if that does happen.

Naomi Seiler has accepted the position of Outreach Coordinator and will be starting in May.

Another Pilgrim member has applied for the open position of Volunteer Coordinator.

Pastor Ashley requested that we have a preliminary 2025 budget ready for review by early September.

Sylvie will be on site starting May 19. There will be an official "handoff" during the 8:00am service.

New Business

Summer Meeting - No July Meeting

Quarterly Income statement - Discussion of the new consolidated income statement. Council agreed that it is useful and valuable. Discussed adjustments that would improve message of the report to the general congregation. Discussion of a new titles, "General Fund Giving" and "Expenses" were suggested titles. Consideration of adding a narrative.

"Socializing"

Last month, we evaluated what a transition is and acknowledged how difficult it can be to journey through the weeks, months and many times, years of being in a transition.

In the older adult, two situations that are very difficult to deal with are retirement and a loss of a spouse or partner.

Learning to reach out and socialize with people can become very difficult. It is documented that loneliness is an epidemic in this country. The COVID pandemic did not help. For over a year and in some instances, still to this day, people are leery to gather with others. We were forced to remain solitary. For many, transitioning from this way of daily living is difficult. Yet, it is a known fact that to age well, one needs to surround themselves with others. Being with others wards off dementia and brings joy and smiles to our days.

Pilgrim provides many opportunities to be with other church members in a social situation. There is *Funsetters*, where one can enjoy a meal while socializing; and various card groups, such a *Sheepshead* and *Scopa*. Card playing not only gets one amongst others, but also challenges one's mental capacities. Many women in the church enjoy visiting with other women at the monthly *Women's Journey gathering* or *Coffee Chat.* For other mental stimulation, folks could form a book club.

Stepping forward for the first time to participate in these groups can be a bit intimidating, but once that friendly "hello" is extended, the smiles and sharing begin. Don't hesitate if you find yourself alone. Reach out and find a place where you enjoy being

Children's Ministry Coordinator Job Description

<u>Principal Function</u>: The Children's Ministry Coordinator is a valuable member of the church staff and is responsible for planning and facilitating Christian education classes, programming and special events for children 3K to 6th grade.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities:

Assist the Elem/Middle School Coordinator with children's ministry programming for children 3K through 6th grade, including Vacation Bible School, Christmas program, and other special events

Prepare and facilitate Christian education classes for 3K-6th grade on Sunday mornings during the program year

Provide a nurturing presence for children and a reassuring environment for parents

Insure that Children's Ministries operates under Pilgrim's safe sanctuary guidelines

Help recruit, train and empower volunteers

Contribute to the preparation of the annual children's ministry report.

Keep Children's Ministry bulletin boards current throughout the year

Required Knowledge, Skills and Abilities:

Ability to teach bible stories and diversity foundations in a nurturing, loving and non-judgmental way in keeping with the philosophy of the United Church of Christ

Gracious, mature, responsive, pleasant, and can demonstrate working as a team player.

Independent, able to set priorities, attentive to detail, great follow through and organized. Supervisory duties for the Children's Ministry Coordinator will be the responsibility of the Pastor. The Staff Relations Committee will provide any needed support and/or guidance, as requested by the Pastor.

Every Church Staff Member is an at-will employee of the congregation, and is ultimately responsible to the Church Council and Pastor. Church Staff members maintain a shared promise of confidentiality, conflict resolution, and cooperation. The Church Staff Member also understands the need to attract and retain church volunteers, (which may include but not be limited to, congregational members / friends /visitors) as he or she works to maintain and extend the mission of Pilgrim United Church of Christ. The Staff Relations Committee will provide any needed support and/or guidance to all Church Staff Members, as requested by the individual employee, the Pastor and/or the Church Council.

MISSIONS: Pilgrim is a "mission church," so let's keep our work going through a variety of wonderful events available all year long.


