This past week, I stopped to see Ross Walker and Erv Uecker (long time members of Pilgrim) at their home in Alexian Village. Ross and Erv have a long history with the church and with Pilgrim. I believe Erv was ordained 40 some years ago in the LCA (now ELCA). He and Ross have much of their lives engaged in ministry. At one point in the conversation, Erv looked at me and said, "So what do you think the church (Footnote: think BIG church... not just Pilgrim but all congregations and denominations) will look like in a few years?" That's a great question, and I was caught off guard by it. I want to confess that this is one of those questions that finds me in the middle of the night and it runs around in my head. What will the churches look like when I retire in 25 years? Or if my kids decide to have children, what will my grandchildren's church look like? And I have not yet found a good answer. So I simply looked at Erv and Ross and said, "I don't know what it will look like. But I think it will still be here, maybe just a little bit different."

"What will the church look like?" I know that this question haunts clergy, but also Conference Ministers, Associate Conference Ministers, Bishops, and Iay (not ordained) folks. And I believe that there have been tens of thousands, if not hundreds of thousands of dollars spent at examining trends, projecting growth/decline, with consultants hired to help congregations think about 'the church of the future.' And at the end of the day, after data has been gathered, my guess is that everyone comes up with the same answer: *"I don't know what it will look like. But I think it will still be here, maybe just a little different."*

I suppose this is an interesting topic for the month of October: a month where we typically devote to stewardship, giving, and hope for the future. And that will be no different for us this year. We will have stewardship moments, stewardship letters, time and talent sheets, and pledge cards this month so we can plan for our next year—2025. To have a pastor identify that they don't know what the long-term future of the church looks like feels a bit counter intuitive (at least to me). But I also know that the Magic 8 Ball in the narthex will not help us figure out what lays ahead for us as a congregation. Nor will it provide any answers to the question that finds me in the middle of the night.

And that is okay. In fact, it is more than okay. The church has ALWAYS lived amid uncertainty. The church has always lived with one foot at the cross and one foot in the empty tomb—at the very intersection of life and death. And that is where we SHOULD live. Because the church does not belong to me nor should it serve me. Just like the church does not belong to any member or any congregation and nor should it serve them. *The church belongs to God.*

And I know that God, as I know them, is a God that can hold both death and life, suffering and restoration, uncertainty and hope together. I find this incredibly comforting. And I am reminded of two of my favorite Al-Anon phrases: *One day at a time... together we can make it.*

We cannot know what the future holds. We can plan—carefully, mindfully, prayerfully, and humbly. We must remember that we can only work one day at a time. And that we do that work *together*. This is, and always has been, the foundation of the church: *working together, one day at a time,* doing the best we can with what we have, and trusting that God takes care of the rest.

What will the church look like? I don't know. And that is okay. Because it is not mine to know. Instead, *it is ours to discover, together*.





Portlight isn't the drop-in type facility most people think of when they hear homeless shelter. It's part of a program aimed at helping people get back on their feet. The shelter can house as many as 20 adults and children at one time, and clients must participate in weekly case management meetings. Those housed at the shelter can reside for a maximum of 90 days, although the average stay is about 47 days. Portlight Shelter is part of Family Promise.

So you find yourself in the role of caregiver....what do you do now?

First, don't deny the fact that your life has changed. Be realistic that this is your new norm and figure out what needs your caregiver has and what needs YOU have.

These many times can be different. There are agencies available that can assist with a loved ones needs. These vary from bathing assistance, possible day services, medication assistance, etc. Yes, these services are costly, but that is where the question of YOUR needs come into play. If you find yourself as a caregiver exhausted, short on patience, depressed, etc., these services may benefit you as much as they do your loved one. If money is a hard-ship, the ADRC may have government dollars available to assist you if you meet the financial qualifications. DO NOT hesitate to contact the ADRC on this. You have been paying taxes all your life and if you are now in need for help, it is YOUR turn. An Information and Assistance Specialist at the ADRC will be very helpful to ascertain what services would be best in you and your loved one's unique situation. **The number for the ADRC in Ozaukee County is 262-284-8120**.

In so many instances, caregivers try to do everything themselves—maintaining their normal responsibilities while picking up their loved ones' daily responsibilities—at the same time as giving physical and emotional care to their loved one. Sometimes you could use some help that may be very minor, such as picking up groceries or a prescription. Friends usually want to help but do not know what to do. They may be happy to help you if you ask them.

Remember: *We are not meant to be in this world alone*—reach out to those who are your friends or neighbors and see if they might lend you a hand.

The Pilgrim WISE Team would like to thank everyone who filled out a survey earlier this spring about mental health issues. 48 surveys were completed, providing us with a lot of data to help shape this new program. Our next steps are to create a Mission Statement and Covenant. 
