It is Monday, August 26, 2024, and it is my first day back in the office following my sabbatical. I met with Pastor Sylvie this morning, and it sounds like you all had a lovely summer together. She spoke so incredibly fondly of her time with all of you. I am proud of you, Pilgrim, for taking such good care of her, and proud of her for taking such good care of you.

This summer I was able to take a sabbatical (which is different than a long vacation). A sabbatical is a time for specific rest, renewal, and education. Most sabbaticals have a goal or a purpose. My goal and purpose was to finish up the last piece of my experiential education for my Master of Arts in Clinical Mental Health Counseling. I started this degree in the middle of the COVID pandemic because I felt terribly unprepared to handle the shifting needs of the congregation—which were very much focused on mental health. I attended classes for 4 years, year-round at LU. The last requirement was to complete an internship in a clinical mental health setting. This summer, I spent 300 hours as an intern at Rogers Behavioral Health-Brown Deer Clinic in the Severe and Persistent Mental Health unit. Most of my summer was spent their learning from the staff and patients about the different symptoms, treatment, and management of a variety of mental illnesses. Gosh, friends, the human experience is so diverse and painful and beautiful all at the same time.

Early on, I recognized the difference between the work of clinical mental health and the church. And I found a deep need to continue to tap into my deep sense of spirituality. Throughout the summer, I worked with a spiritual director and attended worship. I was able to worship at Mount Horeb and my home congregation, and I realized: *it IS very lovely to be able to go to church*. To sit in a pew. To worship. To sing. To be prayed for. I realized how much I missed just being able to worship with a community.

I was also able to lean into something that I have always known deep in my bones—worship can exist outside of church walls. So, I tapped into my love of nature. My family and I traveled to Glacier National Park, where we woke up early to hike 4 miles to find waterfalls. We sat beside a still and clear Lake MacDonald and watched the sun set. We played rounds of SkipBo, Uno, and A-Hole (a family favorite card game). But the gem of my summer was the 6 days I spent in the Boundary Water Canoe Area Wilderness with 4 other women. Over the course of 6 days, we covered about 44 miles. We were away from cellphone towers, roads, other people, cars, motorized boats, and running water. And we let the rhythm of our bodies fall into the rhythm of the world. We were greeted in the mornings by loons. We were lulled to sleep by crickets. The wind tousled us on the lakes at mid-day. And we just existed. And it was one of the simplest most glorious things I have ever done.

And then, on the last Saturday night of my sabbatical, I let the high school version of me rock out with the Smashing Pumpkins and Green Day at American Family Field.

And here I am on Monday, August 26, 2024, already back into the rhythm of life in the church. And I am grateful for the quiet I found in my office. The comfort in this routine. The feeling of being back home again, with you.

Thank you, Pilgrim, for the gift of the last three months. Now, we go—together (until the summer of 2031 when my next sabbatical comes around).







Pilgrim UCC Council Meeting

Minutes of June 20, 2024

Treasurer's Report – Regular giving for May was \$24k, \$4k below May last year. Regular giving is \$6k YTD ahead of last year and \$10k ahead of 2024 budget. Other giving in May was \$2,345 toward the lift. That brough the lift total to \$43K. Endowment fund values in May were up \$10K and are up \$18k YTD. Operating Expenses totaled \$20k for the month (\$10k below budget). Building maintenance was \$7k under budget in May due to the reversal of \$7k of Wegner expenses in January which receive insurance proceeds in May. This was unexpected. In summary, May shows a \$5k operating gain before depreciation and a \$19k gain YTD.

Pilgrim UCC Council Meeting

Minutes of July 4 & 5, 2024

On July 3, 2024 Geoff Nauth, President, received an Email from Neal Hobbs of the Building & Assets Committee. Neal had completed his negotiations with Mared Mechanical for purchase and installation of new AC units for the sanctuary. He was seeking Council approval and execution of a contract for purchase and installation of the units in the amount of \$47,480. Neal reported that Mared Mechanical had agreed to hold their quoted price through July 5th.

Neal outlined how we would pay for this work as follows: "\$32,840 from the Building Maintenance Reserve account + \$1,012.5 from the Building Memorial + \$2,500 from the Undesignated Memorial + \$5,346 from Eickstedt Building & Assets Endowment Fund (the remainder of the minimum distribution for 2024) + MM – Building Bequest \$3,112.86 = \$44,811.36. Recommended quote from Mared Mechanical plus contingency amount equals \$52,280. The shortfall of \$7,468.64 needed to fund the project will be drawn from the General Operating Funds account until the Eickstedt MM \$50,000 CD matures."

On July 4, 2024 Geoff Nauth, President polled the Council by email requesting their vote for approval of the Mared contract. Geoff received a Yes Vote from Beth, Jill, and Rachel, and voted yes as well. With an approval of a majority of the Council Geoff as President signed the contract with Mared Mechanical.



Becoming a Caregiver

Just the other day, my husband's good friend's wife went in for a hip replacement. All went well with the surgery. She came out of the surgery and was responding well and the next minute, she had a stroke. A severe one, at that. Unbeknownst to my husband's friend, it would now appear he may soon find himself in the role of a full time caregiver. That is sometimes how quickly things change in life. No longer can he do the things he wants to or go help another neighbor (he was quite well known to be the guy to call).

In June, we discussed transitions—that period of time when our image of what our life will be like...changes. Many times we have some knowledge that the change may occur, but many times, such as in the above scenario, we get thrown full force into our "new normal." Most of us have not been trained to be caregivers, so we flounder in our new role and our whole self identity is turned upside down. What to do?

There is no doubt that the needs of our loved ones must be first and foremost but, the caregiver themselves also need to find ways to take care of themselves. For each person, the way to take care of themselves may be different. The important thing is to determine what brings one joy. It may be a walk in the park, gardening, being able to have coffee with a friend, playing cards with the guys, etc. Carving out time to do whatever it is, is the important thing. I once knew a woman who was caring for both her husband and her mother-in-law, both who had dementia. The best she could do for herself was spend fifteen minutes every morning to do Tai Chi on her deck.

If you find yourself or know of a person who is caring for another, encourage them to find and do that little "something" that will help them as they labor in love taking care of another.

Children's Ministry Coordinator Job Description

<u>Principal Function:</u> The Children's Ministry Coordinator is a valuable member of the church staff and is responsible for classes, programming and special events for children 3K to 6th grade.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities:

Assist the Elem/Middle School Coordinator with children's ministry programming for children 3K through 6th grade, including Vacation Bible School, Christmas program, and other special events

Prepare and facilitate Christian education classes for 3K-6th grade on Sunday mornings during the program year

Provide a nurturing presence for children and a reassuring environment for parents

Insure that Children's Ministries operates under Pilgrim's safe sanctuary guidelines

Help recruit, train and empower volunteers

Contribute to the preparation of the annual children's ministry report.

Keep Children's Ministry bulletin boards current throughout the year

Required Knowledge, Skills and Abilities:

Ability to teach bible stories and diversity foundations in a nurturing, loving and non-judgmental way in keeping with the philosophy of the United Church of Christ

Gracious, mature, responsive, pleasant, and can demonstrate working as a team player.

Independent, able to set priorities, attentive to detail, great follow through and organized.

Supervisory duties for the Children's Ministry Coordinator will be the responsibility of the Pastor. The Staff Relations Committee will provide any needed support and/or guidance, as requested by the Pastor.

Every Church Staff Member is an at-will employee of the congregation, and is ultimately responsible to the Church Council and Pastor. Church Staff members maintain a shared promise of confidentiality, conflict resolution, and cooperation. The Church Staff Member also understands the need to attract and retain church volunteers, (which may include but not be limited to, congregational members / friends /visitors) as he or she works to maintain and extend the mission of Pilgrim United Church of Christ. The Staff Relations Committee will provide any needed support and/or guidance to all Church Staff Members, as requested by the individual employee, the Pastor and/or the Church Council.


