Grace and peace to you

I am sitting in my office on Tuesday, October 29. In one week, this country will go to the voting booth (or will have already casted a vote) to elect the next President of the United States of America.

I know that this has been an incredibly contentious election cycle, and this is made complicated that we live in Wisconsin—one of the states that each candidate looks to win electoral votes. The rhetoric and language I have heard in the past few weeks breaks my heart. So often words are cloaked with the assumption that one party is good, and the other party is evil. This language comes from both sides of the political aisle. No one is immune from the constant demonization of the 'other.'

It is not my business (nor any clergy person or religious denomination) to tell you how to vote. Instead, I believe it is my business to tell you what I believe will happen after you vote.

The sun will rise on Wednesday, November 6. It will make its way over Lake Michigan, then Port Washington, the east side of Grafton and Mequon, and it will catch the top of a steeple seated on the crest of a hill. Whatever happens on that first Tuesday in November, Pilgrim will still be here on Wednesday November 6. And on Thursday November 7, and the day after that and the day after that. And we will gather together on November 10, 2024, for worship at 8:00 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. And the people of Pilgrim will sit side by side in the pews. Some of you will be elated. Some of you will be angry and scared. Some of you will be relieved that this election season is over. I do not want to trivialize the feelings, complicated as they are, that all of us will have. But, before we get there, I want to ground us-all of us-as members of a very Purple Church (meaning that we have a diverse group of political opinions within our congregation), knowing that we will remain a community. Democrats and Republicans, Libertarians and Progressives, and Trump, Harris, Stein, West, Kennedy supporters and nonvoters will sit their butts down in the pews next to one another. And we will still be a community. And we will still love each other ferociously. And we will still trust that God is alive living and working through the ministry that we do here at Pilgrim. And we are going to keep on keeping on, doing everything we can to make this world a better place (just like Christ instructs us to do).

And our work, as a Purple Church, is to embody love and trust for one another. The world may try to get us to demonize one another. The world may try and tell us our neighbors can't be trusted. The world may try to convince us to hate, but I know without a doubt that hate is not in this congregation's DNA. Love is the only language written on our bones.

I am reminded of a quote by Brene Brown, "People are hard to hate up close. Move in. Speak truth to bullsh*t. Be civil. Hold hands with strangers. Strong back. Soft front. Wild heart."

Let us lean into our call—to show the world what an inclusive church looks like—a church where we keep each other close, we listen, we choose civility, sometimes we hold hands and hug (always with permission), and we stand tall beside each other. We can show the world what a table, set wide and far, can hold. What a people can do when they love each other first.




Women's Advent Candlelight Service, Monday, December 9





CAREGIVERS / W.I.S.E. TEAM

On Sunday, September 29th, at both services, Marianne, a new member to Pilgrim and a participant in



the caregiver support group at Pilgrim, presented her views on how and why gathering with other caregivers is so beneficial. She stated how joining such a group, a caregiver will no longer feel so isolated. Through suggestions by others in the group, one can hear different ways to deal with situations and also may learn new tips to help them care for their loved ones. Support groups are most effective when there are a number of people (10 is a good amount) in similar situations.

Marianne spoke to encourage others to join the Pilgrim group which meets on the second Tuesday of the month at 2:00 PM in the downstairs conference room. Realizing that this time may not be convenient for some people, there are other groups available in Ozaukee County (Caregiver Coffees) that meet at other times during the month. One meets the 1st Monday of each month from 6:30 to 8:00 PM at Providence Place in Grafton-another, the 3rd Friday of each month from 10:00-11:30 AM at Village Pointe Commons in Grafton. This group has an extra benefit - there is respite available for one's loved one while the session is being held. One other group meets the 4th Thursday of every month from 10:00-11:30 AM at Community Methodist Church in Cedarburg. These coffees are open to anyone in the community as is ours at Pilgrim. If you know a friend or neighbor who is struggling in caring for a loved one, please encourage them to attend one of these coffees/support groups. They are all lead by qualified people who encourage all attendees to participate, knowing that what is shared within the group will be held in confidentiality.

These gatherings are many times just the thing a caregiver needs to get them through the rest of the month!

What is mental health stigma?

Mental health stigma erodes confidence that mental illnesses are real, treatable health conditions. We have allowed stigma to create barriers around effective treatment and recovery.

What does mental health stigma do ?

- * Stigma can make dealing with a mental health condition even more difficult to deal with than the illness itself.
- * Fear of rejection and discrimination can delay treatment interventions that can lead to recovery.
- * Stigma feeds on silence and shame.

What can we do to end mental health stigma?

- Pay attention to the language we use when talking about mental health. It often plays a big role in keeping stereotypes and myths alive.
- Understand that having a mental health condition is the same as having a physical health condition.
- Remove labels and stereotypes, and talk openly about mental health.
- Show compassion and love to people with mental health conditions.
- Continue to educate yourself and others about mental health awareness.

The WISE Team is a group of church members who are dedicated to increasing our community outreach to include, embrace, and provide a place for people with mental health conditions in the life and work of the Church.


