Merry Christmas & Happy New Year to you!

It was 4:35 p.m. on Sunday, December 15, 2024. I pulled my boots on, zipped up my coat, and walked down to the chicken coop to let the ladies (our three chickens) in for the night. Even though it was only 4:35 p.m., I did not need to put them on their perch. I did not need to scoop Cluck Norris (our Barred Rock, who likes to push the boundaries of what an 'acceptable' bedtime is) up to put her back in the coop. I shut the coop door and peeked in on the girls. They were already huddled together, sleeping. I said, "Good night, ladies!" while I shut the door and headed back inside, at 4:37 p.m. That same night, I watched the streetlights pop on. One, two, then three before our street was lit up in the failing light of this December day. Or evening? Or night?

It was dark.

I happened upon a book by Sharei Green and Beckah Selick, called God's Holy Darkness. And it says this:

"The Spirit of God dwells in the holy darkness where we are invited to be held in God's love. Angels appeared to the shepherds in the dark and told them of a baby in a manger.

The deep dark of the ocean holds more life than has ever been discovered.

We are reminded of the size of God's creation through the boundless beautiful black of outer space."

It is so tempting to curse the dark. It is hard to find its beauty.

We believe we are people of "light." That is what we celebrate during the Christmas season, that we remember that God's light came into the world. But we cannot forget that just as God's light came into the world, so did God's dark. And that is where the light lives.

Surely, before the light had shape and form, it had to rest in the quiet, holy darkness of Mary's womb. And be **still-rest-grow**. The light had to settle in early, snuggle up next to his mom, and fall asleep in her arms. Mary, I am sure, was told, "Rest while the baby is sleeping. Nap while the baby naps." And be still and rest.

That feels like a slap in the face to this culture of (over) productivity. To be still-rest-grow. Because as people of the light we must do, do more, and then do some more, until we collapse on our beds, our chairs, our couches exhausted and then groan when our alarm jars us from sleep.

And yet, the darkness calls us to rest. And the natural world around us has fallen into its embrace. Cluck, all tucked in before I can chase her in with the other ladies. The trees are lying still in this season of winter. The streetlights, even they, too, recognize the dark.

It is dark. And that's not bad. Well, unless we will ourselves to live only in the light.

But even the light must rest. And, who are not the light, should rest, too.

This season of winter, of Christmas, is made for rest.

We are not made just for work. We are not made just for light. We are also made for rest.

We were created in the dark. Listen, friends, to the ebb and flow of this season.

I pray this January you find some time to rest and be still.

CAREGIVERS / W.I.S.E. TEAM



Most people step into the role of a caregiver out of love for the person who is struggling.

As mentioned before, people usually are unaware of what is involved when one takes on this role. It can be challenging and full of frustrations and worries. Yet, it can be very transformative. Caregiving has a way of reshaping priorities, allowing one to focus on what really matters. Simple moments spent with the loved ones, like sharing stories, photos, or just hold-

ing hands become shared treasured memories. Letting the loved one guide what makes them happy and then joining in that activity with them is the formula to create these loving memories.

If the loved one has dementia, the caregiver needs to enter into the care receiver's world - that being what is occurring at the present moment. Those of us without cognitive decline find it hard to do this as our mind is constantly running wild with thoughts of the past and plans for the future whether those be in a few days or some years from now. Therapists who encourage people to meditate say that being in the "present" will slow down our nervous system, yet so few of us listen to those words of advice. Being with a memory-impaired person forces us to enter their world. These quiet times remind us of the strong intimate bond we have with our loved one. The caregiver many times will find strength within themselves that they did not even realize they had.


If siblings or adult children are available to share in the tasks of caregiving, the main caregiver may find they also grow closer to those individuals. A caregiver may find support through these people, celebrating small victories and comforting one another when necessary. If this is not the case, then reaching out to others through

support groups can help.

Caregiving teaches lessons in patience, empathy and self-sacrifice.

Many people find that when they reflect on this role, they see it in the light of the love that Jesus preached. Looking at it in this angle, can change one's perspective on caregiving as that of not being a burden, to one of it being a blessing.

WISE TEAM ARTICLE

Myths and Facts About Mental Health



There are many misconceptions about mental health that contribute to stigma around mental health issues. Here are some facts from the WISE Team to help you start the new year with some new perspective!

Myth #1: Mental illness doesn't affect people like me.

Fact: The World Health Organization estimates that one in four people will experience a mental health issue over the course of their lifetime. Some studies indicate that up to one in five Americans experience mental health issues during any given year. Mental health disorders can affect anyone regardless of age, gender, or background.

Myth #2: People with mental health conditions are likely to be dangerous or violent.

Fact: People with mental health conditions are no more likely to commit violent acts than the general public. Only about 5% of violent crimes are committed by people with severe mental illness. However, people with mental illness are up to 10 times more likely to be victims of violent crime.

Myth #3: *Mental health conditions are a sign of weakness and people can overcome them if they just try enough.*

Fact: Mental health conditions are not due to weakness or a lack of willpower. Many factors outside of a person's control contribute to their mental health including brain chemistry, genetics, physical health, and life experiences.

Myth #4: Mental health conditions are permanent.

Fact: While some people will experience mental health conditions for the rest of their life, many find they are able to manage their condition with treatment. Others may experience a single episode of mental illness or may find that their mental health fluctuates with periods of more and less symptoms.

Myth #5: Only people with mental health challenges need to think about mental health.

Fact: Mental wellness is like physical wellness. All of us can take steps to improve our mental well being. In addition, you don't have to be a mental health professional to support people with mental health challenges. Anyone can show support by having open conversations to reduce stigma, being a non-judgmental listener, and letting people know that you are there for them.

Treasurer's Report -

- Giving/Income
 - * Regular giving for October totaled \$25k, which was the same as September. This is \$2k over the same period last year.
 - * Overall giving is under budget by \$17k YTD and is over last year by \$8k YTD.
- Endowment fund values were down \$5k in October and are up \$35k YTD.
- Expenses
 - * October's overall Operating Expenses were \$28k. This was right on budget.

Stewardship

- As of 11/14, 64 pledges totaling \$185,600 have been received
- In 2024, we received a total of 59 pledges.
- Target goal for 2025 budget is \$280,000.

Treasurer's Report Summary

From a pure Operating income/expense perspective, we broke even in October and have \$4k of income year-to-date.

Other notable items

- The two CDs totaling \$77k are being renewed for a 2nd time for 30 days at 4.25%.
- The Pilgrim Family Fund is down to \$1,300 not sure if this needs to be promoted with the Holidays coming up?
- Budget Only revision on this budget is for the increased cost of property insurance. No carriers would bid on our account, and the only proposal we have is from Church Mutual for \$25,000. This is the minimum premium that this carrier requires.
- Discussion regarding how to record income and expense for lift were discussed

Motion to approve Treasurer's Report as presented and pertinent discussion was made by Rachel. Seconded by Beth. Treasurer's report was approved.
