Grace and peace to all of you,

It's January.

January—the month that has lingering darkness, colds winds, and no more holiday lights. January—the month lingers and sticks to my bones. January—the month that feels like it will last forever. January—the month many of us endure.

I am writing this to all of you two days before Christmas Eve. It is 4:00 p.m. The light in the sky is already fading, the darkness is already settling in. I am loathe to endure January. But it will come, surely as the sun will rise. And *I wonder to myself, what would it look like to welcome January?* I wonder what it would look like to let January be what it is, and nothing more. Certainly, I cannot expect it to be like July. My struggle is that I want January to be something it can never be. So, I expect the moon to welcome me in late afternoons when I tuck my chickens in, and the snow to crunch under my boots, and goosebumps to fill my arms.

I wonder as I write this, how much of this is due to January or our inability to shift our expectations to match the seasons? Maybe I feel like I must 'endure' January because I try to force myself to keep pace with the frantic pace of late summer and autumn. As Katherine May writes in her book *Wintering*, for those of us with ancestors from the Northern Hemisphere, January was a time everything slowed down just so people could survive. People turned inward. I am going to stop short of calling this *rest*, because I do not think there was much 'resting' involved. The pace changed. The expectations changed.

This year, I may try to let January be January. I may try and invite the dark in. I may do my best to welcome the cold. I may allow myself a slower pace. I may pay more attention to the moon. I may gaze longer at the stars. I may linger in the quiet of a winter morning. I may have another cup of tea and piece of bread. I may knit up a wool hat. I may grab another book. I may take a nap. I may remind myself that January will not last forever. This season will pass at last, and all to soon (thanks, Mary Oliver). Even January carries within it gifts, unique to this month. We have a choice to see and welcome these gifts. It reminds me of that phrase I heard years ago, "*If you choose not to have joy in the snow, you will have less joy in your life but the same amount of snow.*"

So, too, with January. January is ripe with treasures and gifts. January is no stranger to joy. *Maybe we just need to let ourselves adjust to the dark, as well as the light, so we can recognize its treasures, gifts, and joy.*



Confirmation Classes


Confirmation Classes are held on Wednesday nights through May 6.



Pilgrim UCC Council Meeting - November 18, 2025, 6:30pm

APPROVED COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

Present: Geoff Nauth, Dave Nestler, Rev. Ashley Nolte, Beth Eernisse, Joy Bloemer, Nick Sancomb, Marilyn Linde and Jill Timmerman

Centering Moment offered by Nick – Thanksgiving reflection. Centering moment for December – Beth

Next Meeting Date: Wednesday, December 17, 7:00 pm

Approval of Meeting Minutes: Reviewed draft minutes from October's meeting. No corrections/updates proposed. Marilyn motioned to approve. Dave seconded. Motion carried and minutes approved.

Treasurer's Report

Incoming

Regular giving for October totaled \$34k - \$9k over the same period last year and \$5k over budget. Overall giving, however, remains \$11k under budget YTD. We collected another \$625 for the summer appeal, bringing the total for the campaign to \$24k to help to surpass the 2025 budget gap.

Endowment fund values were up \$5k in October and are up \$62k YTD. The Mission Endowment Fund gifted \$7k to help fund operation of St Ben's warming room.

Outgoing

October operating expenses were \$30k which was on budget

Summary

From a pure operating income/expense perspective, we report \$5k income in October. YTD, we report \$27k of income – without the \$24k received from the summer appeal, we would report income of \$3k.

Other

Thank you to Pilgrim members for answering the call to replenish the Pilgrim Family Fund. Balance is now at \$2k.

Jill motioned to approve Treasurer's Report as presented. Motion seconded by Marilyn. Treasurer's report approved.

Pastor's Report

Pastor's report reviewed and discussed. Special note regarding staffing – there has been interest in both the Treasurer and Missions Director positions and Ashley/Staff Relations are working with the candidates. Additionally, someone has stepped forward regarding the Finance Deacon slot.

Committee Liaisons

Building and Assets –

Flow logic value and coffee maker projects are complete. Equipment is up and running.

Hearing assistance proposal is moving forward.

Finance – no additional updates

Staff – no updates beyond what is noted in Pastor's report section above.

Old Business

New member, active/inactive status – tabled discussion for now

Council cloud storage – no update

WISE team covenant approval – tabled discussion to now

2026 Church Budget discussion – Overall response to pledge campaign has been encouraging. Reviewed preliminary budget submitted to Council by FAC team. Several Council members expressed concern about the size of the projected loss for the coming year. Specifics of several budgeted line items were discussed. Council is directing the FAC team to revisit the proposed budget and to submit revisions prior to December's Council meeting.

Jesus said the greatest commandment is to "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind, and to love your neighbor as yourself." (Matt. 22:38-40) Jesus made no distinction between various members of society. He included all people this commandment.

We, the WISE team of Pilgrim United Church of Christ of Grafton Wisconsin, will work to honor the inherent dignity of all God's children by promoting an environment of safety around mental health and wellbeing at Pilgrim through acceptance, belonging, and inclusion.

As people of Pilgrim UCC in Grafton, we realize that we are graced by the gifts, stories, and experiences of all our members. We recognize that we all have mental health, and we are intentional in our inclusion of those who live with mental health challenges. We care about the whole person: body, heart, mind and soul. We affirm the deep and constant movement of God's Holy Spirit, seeking to bring us to the fullness of life. We believe that all people are beloved by God, and if a person lives with a mental health challenge that person has a right to be seen as a person first.

Sometimes individuals with mental health challenges such as brain disorders, mental illnesses, addictions, and trauma feel cut off from God and do not feel included. It is our calling to communicate to all individuals that God loves all of us equally, even when we do not feel the love of the Holy Spirit in our lives. People with mental health challenges have gifts to be offered in our faith community, and we want everyone to feel fully welcomed, included, supported and engaged in the life, work and leadership of our church.

We, Pilgrim UCC in Grafton, Wisconsin, vote to be a welcoming, inclusive, supportive and engaged (WISE) congregation for mental health.

Call to action

As a congregation, We pledge to create a welcoming environment for people with mental health challenges and their families, with the support of the WISE team, by:

- Educating ourselves and offering educational opportunities to help our whole congregation understand the spectrum of mental health.
- Examining our own attitudes and preconceived notions about mental health and to confront our own ingrained stigma in an effort to reduce social stigma
- Actively welcoming those with mental health challenges and their support givers into our faith community and providing a safe environment in which people can tell their stories and share their journeys

As a congregation, We pledge to include people with mental health challenges in the life, work and leadership of the congregation by supporting our church leadership in:

- Recruiting, nominating and supporting persons with mental health challenges to serve on teams and in leadership positions within the congregation.
- Being open to hiring/calling persons with mental health challenges.

A WISE (Welcoming, Inclusive, Supportive, and Engaged) Congregation for Mental Health for all with mental health challenges and their loved ones.

As a congregation, We pledge to support people in our congregation who have mental health challenges and their families, with the support of the WISE team, by:

Reaching out to those suffering from brain disorders, mental illnesses, addictions, and trauma in the same way we reach out to those living with other physical illnesses, offering companionship and compassion for individuals and families living with mental health challenges.

As a congregation, We pledge to engage with other organizations that work at the intersection of mental health and faith/spirituality/religion, with the support of the WISE team, by:

- Welcoming and encouraging outside groups who deal with mental health challenges, brain disorders, mental illnesses, addictions, and trauma to use our church facilities.
- Engaging with external organizations to find opportunities to be in shared mission, ministry and advocacy together, as well as working with our church's ministry teams, the UCC Health Network and the UCC Disabilities Ministry.

This vote affirms that we join in the process of continuously becoming more welcoming, inclusive, supportive and engaged with all of God's people.
