Grace and peace to you all

I want to invite you to pay attention. Each day on the mission trip, we had to pay attention. Every morning we picked a color and a theme, and were invited to be on the lookout for the *color and theme of the day*. Some of our colors were yellow, purple, blue, and orange; our themes were community, hands/feet, summer, and light/dark. It was fun watching the kids and adults pay attention. It provided a different perspective to the words, "Pay attention." These are words I have found myself using more often in the last few years, especially as a parent teaching her children to drive. Before that, as a parent watching her children get on their bikes, or cross the street, or learn how to use a gas stove. The words "pay attention" have become a regular occurrence in my life.

I find a stark juxtaposition between the words "pay attention" on the mission trip versus "pay attention" as a parent. On the mission trip, "pay attention" was spoken as an invitation to awareness and curiosity. As a parent, "pay attention" served as a warning to potential danger. I think we spend too much time with the latter form of "pay attention." It has become synonymous with fear and anxious alertness. I wonder how many readers encountered that first line, "I want to invite you to pay attention" in a cautious tone of warning. If you did, I want to honor that feeling. Fear, along with caution, are important emotions. They have truly been essential to our survival. Surely our ancestors would not have survived without a bit of fear and/or caution.

I want us instead to dwell on the first, "pay attention," that comes with a tone of awareness and curiosity. I think the reclamation of 'pay attention' as a position of awe and delight is essential to our lives as people of faith. Jesus was always calling his disciples to "pay attention." He spoke about noticing the birds of the air and the lilies of the field. But he also noticed the fig tree and the storm clouds. He paid attention to the hemorrhaging woman, the man born blind, and the weeping soldier. He was always on the lookout. He scanned the landscape and the crowds, the trees and the tables. One of his greatest instructions to his disciples was to "pay attention," *not out of fear but out of love*.

August is one of the best months to pay attention in this way. As summer wains and days grow shorter, the natural world will start to give us cues of what is to come. Unlike the vibrant cues of September and October, these cues will be subtle: days shortened by a few minutes, mornings just a few degrees cooler, one of two less birds at the feeder, one or two less new blooms in the garden. Pay attention. August is a season of quiet transition, a transition that happens so slowly we will miss it if we are not paying attention. It is a good time to practice paying attention—maybe pick a color each day or week and look for it, when you see it, write it down or take a picture of it. Maybe think of a sound and listen for it, write down when you hear it. Paying attention—especially paying attention with curiosity and awe—takes practice.

Christ invites us to pay attention, so we might find delight in each of these precious days.

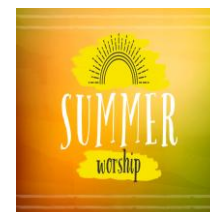
