Grace and peace to you all

I started swimming within the last year. I want to clarify what I mean when I say swimming: I mean put on a suit, goggles, swim cap so I can swim in a straight line and stare at a line on the bottom of the pool. My daughter is a swimmer. She is graceful in the water. She seems to glide effortlessly and has no problem breathing or doing flip turns. She is, for a lack of a better term, a natural. I am not a natural. I remember swimming laps with her at the Y a year ago, and we both ended up at the wall at the same time. She looked at me and said, "Mom, why are you breathing so loud. You don't have to make all those noises." I looked back at her and gasped, "This is the worst. I hate this. Why am I doing something where I can't breathe?" Right before she plunged into the water, she simply said, "Mom, this is not that hard."

But it was hard, at least for me. I also hated it. I hated getting into cold water. I hated that my goggles leaked. I hated not being able to breathe. I hated staring at the same line for an hour. It was miserable and terrible. But...I realized, after swimming for 10-15 minutes, that I started to adjust to the water. My goggles finally stayed put. I found a rhythm with my strokes and my breathing. I discovered that staring at a blue line became meditative. I realized as I pulled myself out of the pool that I had feelings of enjoyment, and I was glad I was able to swim and I did not regret or lament my time in the pool.

I truly did not enjoy it at first. I was not a swimmer at any point in time in my life, and the whole process felt foreign and unfamiliar. I confess I have skipped dozens of practices over the last year. Although while reflecting on swimming, I realize I have never, not once, truly regretted any time spent between the lane lines. It has become a place of calm for me—one that I almost always look forward to.

I wanted to share my experience with swimming with you as we enter the month of September.

We roll back into the program year, and we will continue to ask for volunteers on a regular basis.

When the sign-up sheets come around or are announced, it is easy to think, "Well I can't be an usher because I am nervous talking to people I don't know." Or "I can't read scripture because I hate talking in public." Or "I can't serve on (insert any committee) because I have no idea about (committee topic)." You might say, "Oh, I can't stand doing (whatever that is)." You may not enjoy these things. Truthfully, a lot of work in the church isn't glamorous. It's hard. It's often thankless.

But not once, in almost 20 years of ministry, I never heard someone express regret for volunteering—no matter how much they hated whatever they were doing. And... along the way...some of them learned to enjoy what they previously believed was not enjoyable.

Jump in, friends, the water is fine.

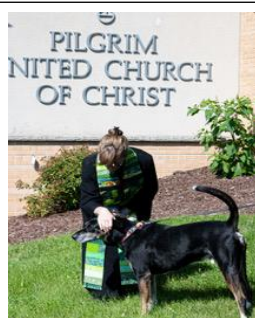

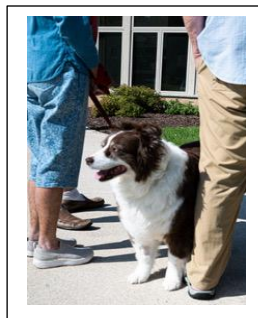
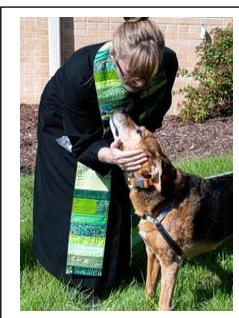

**Approval of May 2026 Meeting Minutes**

Nick motioned to approve. Dave seconded. Minutes approved.

Neal Hobbs provided an update from the Erv & Ross Gift Committee:

The committee has met numerous times. They reviewed the letter from Beth with how the monetary gift should be used. It has been 23 years since the last major church update. The committee also reviewed the Pilgrim Mission Statement to make sure their decisions are aligned with this statement. The committee started with 16 ideas; next they combined like ideas down to four areas; and have now unanimously narrowed the list to the following two focus areas:

1. Accessibility – Physical access to the building, mental impacts, welcoming, is it truly accessible to be here? Is it safe/comfortable to be here?
2. Hospitality – kitchen discussions; community needs; met with potential external charitable organization users to assess their needs; understanding internal users needs such as boy scouts, recitals, girl scouts, choir, bell choir, etc.
 - a. Lower level – Providing handicap accessible restrooms since the lower level is the handicap accessible level; adding powered doors. Kitchen- updating to commercial appliances, fix issues with current grease trap-doesn't flow, will need new hood system with fire suppression to meet current codes.
 - b. 2nd floor-specifically sanctuary-asking for input from choir/bells, looking at handicap accessibility. Next meeting will focus here.

Neal added that they have not limited the options for these areas yet and decisions at this point are not based on costs. The goal is to create an overall plan, even if not everything is achievable now, so that everything is well planned and does not limit future upgrades. Will need architectural renderings to submit to the State and County for approvals.

Council decided that an update should be provided to the congregation on the two focus areas so others are able to provide input.

Treasurer's Report**Incoming**

Regular giving for April totaled \$25k. This is slightly behind the same period last year by \$400 and \$4k under budget for the month. We are approximately \$26k behind budget for the year.

Outgoing

May's overall Operating Expenses were \$28k. This was below budget by \$2k.

Operating expenses to highlight:

- Year to Date payroll is below budget due to Mission Director open position and savings in Youth Ministries.
- Building maintenance is under budget by \$4k YTD. Snow plowing is over budget by \$2k.

Summary

From a pure Operating income/expense perspective, we report a \$1k loss in May. YTD our operating loss is \$24k. This is mostly due to the shortfall of giving in the first quarter.

Marilyn motioned to approve the Treasurers Report. Seconded by Nick. Report approved.

Pastor's Report

- Ashley shared her monthly report.
- Ashley is on vacation next week.

**Liaisons**

- Building & Assets – Dave reported that they have a new committee member. Recent items discussed were venting in the sanctuary, AC replacement for the pastor's office, and potential security items.
- Finance – no updates beyond Treasurer's Report. Giving is slightly up.
- Staff – Still looking for a Missions Director. Pastor Ashley mentioned what an amazing job staff has been doing to cover while we still search for a director.

Old Business**New Business**

- Training for new ushers with Ron will be scheduled in August.

Adjourn

Marilyn motioned to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Dave. Meeting adjourned.

Sound Technician

Job Description

Principal Function: The sound technician is responsible to support and assist the music director, choir, band in Pilgrim's music ministry.

Position Type:

- Part-time position, Stipend per month

- Works closely with video technician
- Perform other duties as necessary.

Missions Coordinator Job Description

Principal Function: The Missions Coordinator is a valuable member of the church staff. The Missions Coordinator is responsible for coordinating and maintaining all church mission projects and communication with pastor, staff, and members.

- Part-time; 10 hours per week, not to exceed 520 hours per calendar year
- Payroll; Monthly
- Flexible Schedule

Essential Duties and Responsibilities:

Provide guidance and mentoring to coordinators regarding timelines and logistics of each mission project such as St. Bens, Habitat for Humanity, Mr. Bob's Under the Bridge, Mt. Horeb, and all seasonal and ongoing projects.

Prepare weekly bulletin blurbs and monthly newsletter articles for Pilgrim's Progress

Keep connected with Church World Services and other mission organizations

The Mission Director facilitates the Mission Team of volunteers, which includes providing direction, planning, and giving reports in a regular manner and reports to Church Council as needed.

Effective communication connecting the mission team through meetings, emails, and personal contact with team members and recruiting for new members

Periodically report results of past projects to congregation

Explore additional areas for mission work and assign a coordinator to facilitate

Coordinates domestic and international adult mission trips

Keep missions bulletin board current
